SPORTS ENRICHMENT

Sports enrichment clubs start up this Monday. All students are available to join sports clubs - they are free and do not require signing up.

- If a student wants to join a club they just need to turn up at the right place at the right time according to the sports clubs list.
- For break time basketball you just need trainers
- For lunch times all clubs (apart from swimming) start at 1.20, and just require trainers (or shorts for gymnastics if you wear a skirt to school)
- For swimming club Tuesday lunch students need to go straight to the gates between the large canteen and inclusion (where they enter the school in the mornings) they will then be escorted to the pool by Mr Hill. If they arrive later than 1.20 they will not be able to get across. It is recommended that students bring packed lunch on days they are swimming, or get something to eat at break. They will have time after swimming to eat.
- For after school clubs, students will need their full PE kit.
- Football trials (boys and girls) Monday 11th September and Monday 18th September after school 3.30 4.45 on the field (meet in outdoor changing rooms)

 Netball trials - Wednesday 15th September - after school - 3.30 - 4.45 on the courts (meet in outdoor changing rooms)


