

Year Group Spotlight



This week the **Year 7 students** completed their Cognitive Abilities Tests. Students were assessed across four key areas:

- Verbal Reasoning Thinking and problem solving with words
- Non-Verbal Reasoning Thinking and problem solving with shapes and space
- Quantitative Reasoning Thinking and problem solving with numbers
- Spatial Reasoning Visualising, picturing and moving shapes around

These tests will help teachers judge progress over the academic year and help the school to make a decision about what set they should be in for some of their subjects.

On Monday year 7 played their first Competitive football match versus Nicolas Breakspear. The team got off to a great start with a goal from **Caden A** putting us one nil up. Soon after, the away team equalised before **Caden** scored another fine goal for Townsend to go into half time 2:1 up. However, unfortunately, the players became tired as the game went on and we ended up losing 6:2. A huge well done to all of the squad, lots of positives to take from the game. Player of the match was **Josh C** for an outstanding performance in goal. Thank you to those who came to support your child and the school.

Year 9:

Year 9 have made a great start to their 3 year GCSE journey!

Since starting school on 6th September we have had two guest speakers, 1 representative from The Oddballs Foundation and the others from the Army discussing potential careers and courses within this line of work.

Oddballs Foundation are a group of men who travel around the UK providing assemblies to secondary school pupils educating them on testicular cancer and how to safely check one's body. This talk was incredibly informative and provided our students with the knowledge of how to check your body safely and who to approach if you believe something is wrong. Our students all appreciated this and learnt something new.

The Army spoke about potential career opportunities within this line of work, with videos, personal stories and even equipment to show the students as part of their session. Years 9 and 10 were heavily engaged and there were tonnes of questions that were successfully answered at the end! They were signposted to appropriate links and resources if they felt this was something they wanted to explore in the future.

We had our first Cathedral service of this year which is always received so positively by the students. Our next Abbey service will be December 6th and as always, parents and carers are more than welcome to join us.

Subject Spotlight



Science

Year 7:

This half term Year 7 will be focusing on working on scientific skills, cells and the particle model. They will complete different practical activities and learn how to analyse and evaluate the data. These skills will lay the foundation for developing critical scientific skills and knowledge that students will build upon throughout their education. Students will also make a start on their research HW project on 'Famous Scientist' this half term.

Year 8:

This half term Year 8 will continue to build on their knowledge from Year 7 on the periodic table, breathing, respiration, magnets, and electromagnets. They will learn in detail about the different groups in the periodic table and their properties, how magnets and electromagnets are used in the real world, and understanding how our bodies work for maintaining good health and physical fitness. Term 1 HW project for Year 8's will focus on their investigative skills they have acquired over the last year.

GCSE:

Year 9 – GCSE students have made an excellent start this year, with either starting or continuing with their GCSE's. The students continue to build upon the knowledge gained in KS3, and delve deeper into these scientific disciplines and explore more complex concepts and topics. Students will be required to demonstrate a deeper understanding of scientific principles and their applications as they move through the course. Below is an outline of what each of the year groups will cover this term in science:

Year 9 – the atmosphere, radiation, waves, inheritance, and genes.

Year 10 – metallic bonding, electricity and ecosystem

Year 11 – chemical analysis, radioactive materials and the human body


