Why do we believe enrichment programmes are important?

Enrichment can boost academic as well as sports performances, reduce bad behaviour, promote physical health and mental well-being while providing a safe, structured environment for our students to work & study.

We see first hand, that enrichment leads to improvements in social competence & academic performances. These improvements can be seen in better grades, completion of homework & school work, development of social skills and confidence in learning and in the community.

Getting involved in enrichment activities helps children to meet new people from different cultures, religions & backgrounds with whom they can share their daily experiences and interests, while improving social skills as a result. Extracurricular activities help them expand their vast network, which proves beneficial for finding various academic and career opportunities in later life. 
The main objective of enrichment is to make children strong enough from within so that they are able to solve problems themselves.

We have a 3-tier approach to enrichment:

- Enrichment Clubs (lunchtime and after school clubs)
- 2. Whole School Curriculum Enrichment Afternoons (3 per year)

 - Careers
 - RSE
 - Spiritual Reflection
 - · GCSE taster session
 - Targeted revision

3. Trips and Visits:

- Departmental curriculum trips and visits run as much as possible, and after the disruption of the Covid pandemic, we are trying to get these back up and running as much as possible. Previous trips and visits include: Field trips to Swanage, Dartmoor, St Albans, local rivers. Trips abroad to places such as Ypres, Berlin, Iceland, Auschwitz and Boulogne-Sur-Mer. Workshops for subjects such as maths, English, science and drama GCSE and A-level. Biology field trips to North Yorkshire. Art galleries and museums like the Imperial War Museum and the National Gallery. The Houses of Parliament, Food Technology and Business studies trips to Cadbury World and Jimmy's Farm, to name just a few.
- Enrichment and next-steps visits include visits to the theatre and plays, museums, university open days and visits to the University of Cambridge for the scholars Programme, trips for careers, The Apprenticeship Show, Morfa Bay, Harry Potter World...
- Activities Day in July the whole school attends a trip/visit/onsite enrichment activity, examples form July 2022 include: Chessington Park and Zoo, Alton Towers, footgolf, Whipsnade Zoo, Blenheim Palace, Lea Valley Watersports trips, bowling, countryside walks, Milton Keynes shopping, cookery, arts and crafts, drawing workshops, snooker and pool, Hampton Court, Southend-on-Sea
