Townsend Sixth Form provides a challenging, enriching and welcoming environment in which our students are known, nurtured and inspired to grow in academic excellence. The courses we offer are taught by well-qualified, experienced and dedicated teachers in a fully equipped, studious Sixth Form Centre that is highly conducive to independent learning.

Sixth Form

Sixth Form Centre

You will have access to the Sixth Form Centre. This separate wing of the school has been designed to provide Sixth Form students with the best possible working environment.

A quiet study room equipped with desktop computers and Chromebooks, study areas, as well as wireless internet access, provides a comfortable environment to work independently. This is complemented by a suite of classrooms and meeting rooms exclusively for Sixth Form students. School-issued iPads are also a key part to students' independent study. The recently refurbished Sixth Form Hub offers soft seating, a coffee machine, and a fully

equipped kitchen area, providing the perfect space for break and lunchtimes.

The Sixth Form Centre encourages students to gain a sense of belonging, whilst fostering a culture of achievement allowing students to flourish.

Sixth Form Study Programmes

A Level Pathway

A traditional 3 A Level pathway where students choose 3 subjects to study at A Level.

There is also the option to take additional qualifications (subject to GCSE grades), such as Further Mathematics and the Extended Project Qualification.

Hybrid Pathway

Our Sixth Form offers a flexible Hybrid Pathway, combining Advanced Academic Qualifications (AAQs) with traditional A Levels. This approach allows students to tailor their studies by selecting a personalised mix of three A Level subjects and/or AAQs, ensuring a curriculum that aligns with their strengths, interests, and future aspirations.

Complementary studies

In addition to your courses, you will also be required to participate in the complementary studies programme that includes Learning for Life & Religious Education lessons, Physical Education lessons, Core Maths and other courses designed to support your learning.

Choosing what to study



Choosing what to study may be a difficult decision to make. You must first consider what you would like to do after Sixth Form, as this will help you choose an appropriate pathway and subjects for you. Some subjects are more frequently required for entry to degree courses than others.

It is good to do some careful research to think through your possibilities. Take advice from family, friends and teachers so you can make an informed decision, based on accurate up-to-date information - but remember, the final choice is yours as you are the one who will have to put the hard work in. Don't assume you will like the subject at A Level just because you liked it at GCSE – it could be very different. We also suggest that you don't take all new subjects unless you have thoroughly researched them

Academic Progress

It is important that you, your parents/carers and staff know that you are demonstrating progress in your studies. When you join the Sixth Form, your GCSE results will be analysed and you will be given a target grade for each of your courses, based on your GCSE results. Your academic progress will be monitored on a regular basis, and you will be challenged if you are not reaching your potential in any area. The support you receive as a sixth form student is of high quality and teachers are available for individual support when needed.

Throughout Sixth Form, your teachers will regularly report on class attainment. This information will be used to track progress and identify areas that require support. Students who are underperforming will be challenged and supported to improve attainment levels. By the end of Year 12, all students should be demonstrating the ability to succeed in their chosen courses.


Personal Development and Enrichment

We look forward to welcoming you into our Sixth Form community.


